
## **Ancient Foundations**

- Author: Augustine of Hippo
  - North African bishop, theologian, philosopher
- Summary: Augustine's autobiographical account of his conversion and spiritual journey from sin to salvation.
- Quote: "You have made us for yourself, O Lord, and our hearts are restless until they rest in you."



- Author: Augustine of Hippo
- Summary: A defense of Christianity against pagan accusations and a vision of God's eternal kingdom versus earthly kingdoms.

- Author: Thomas Aquinas
  - Italian Dominican Friar and theologian
- **Summary:** A comprehensive theological and philosophical work systematically presenting Christian doctrine and natural theology.
- Quote: "To one who has faith, no explanation is necessary. To one without faith, no explanation is possible."




#### The Divine Comedy (Inferno, Purgatorio, Paradiso, 1320)

- Author: Dante Alighieri
  - Italian poet and philosopher
- Summary: An epic poem following Dante's journey through Hell, Purgatory, and Paradise, representing the soul's journey to God.
- **Quote:** "In His will is our peace." (*Paradiso*)



## The Imitation of Christ (1418-1427)

- Author: Thomas à Kempis
  - German-Dutch priest
- **Summary:** A devotional guide emphasizing inner spiritual life and the imitation of Jesus Christ's humility and love.
- Quote: "Be not angry that you cannot make others as you wish them to be, since you cannot make yourself as you wish to be."

## 95 Theses (1517)

- Author: Martin Luther
  - German, Augustinian monk
- Summary: Luther's formal challenge to the Catholic Church's sale of indulgences sparked the Protestant Reformation by questioning papal authority and calling for spiritual reform.
- Quote: "When our Lord and Master Jesus Christ said 'Repent,' he willed the entire life of believers to be one of repentance."



# Institutes of the Christian Religion (1536)

#### • Author: John Calvin

- French theologian, moved to Geneva
- **Summary:** A systematic presentation of Protestant theology covering God's sovereignty, salvation, and Christian living.
- **Quote:** "Nearly all the wisdom we possess consists of two parts: the knowledge of God and of ourselves."




# The Pilgrim's Progress (1678)

- Author: John Bunyan
  - English Puritan preacher
- **Summary:** An allegorical tale of Christian's journey from the City of Destruction to the Celestial City, representing the soul's path to salvation.
- Quote: "To go back is nothing but death; to go forward is fear of death, and life everlasting beyond it. I will yet go forward."

#### The Practice of the Presence of God (1692)


- Author: Brother Lawrence
  - Born Nicolas Herman
  - French Carmelite friar (the monastery cook)
- Summary: Simple teachings on maintaining continuous awareness of God's presence in everyday activities and work.
- Quote: "The time of business does not with me differ from the time of prayer; and in the noise and clatter of my kitchen, I possess God in as great tranquility as if I were upon my knees."


## Sinners in the Hands of an Angry God (1741)


- Author: Jonathan Edwards
  - American Puritan preacher, theologian, intellectual, and philosopher
  - Yale at 13, president of Princeton, launched the first Great Awakening
- **Summary:** A powerful sermon depicting humanity's precarious position before God's judgment and the urgency of repentance.
- **Quote:** "There is nothing that keeps wicked men at any one moment out of hell, but the mere pleasure of God."



### **Religious Affections (1746)**

- Author: Jonathan Edwards
- **Summary:** An analysis of true versus false religious experience, emphasizing genuine spiritual emotions rooted in understanding.
- Quote: "The degree in which our experience is productive of practice shows the degree in which our experience is spiritual and divine."






## The Christian System (1835)


- Author: Alexander Campbell
  - Scots-Irish American, Restoration Movement
- Summary: Campbell's systematic presentation of New Testament Christianity advocated for Christian unity based solely on biblical authority, rejecting denominational creeds and traditions.
- Quote: "Where the Scriptures speak, we speak; where the Scriptures are silent, we are silent."

- Author: Charles Sheldon
  - American Congregational minister
- Summary: A novel challenging readers to live by asking "What Would Jesus Do?" in every decision and circumstance.
- Quote: "What would Jesus do? He turned and asked himself this question, and it opened up a world of possibilities."




### Orthodoxy (1908)

- Author: G.K. Chesterton
  - English writer, philosopher, apologist
- **Summary:** Chesterton's intellectual and spiritual autobiography defending Christian orthodoxy with wit and paradox.
- **Quote:** "The riddles of God are more satisfying than the solutions of man."



## The Everlasting Man (1925)

- Author: G.K. Chesterton
- Summary: A philosophical outline of human history arguing for Christianity's unique place in human development.
- Quote: "The Christian ideal has not been tried and found wanting; it has been found difficult and left untried."


# The Cost of Discipleship (1937)

- Author: Dietrich Bonhoeffer
  - German Lutheran pastor, anti-Nazi, martyr
- Summary: A powerful call to authentic Christian discipleship, contrasting "cheap grace" with costly, sacrificial following of Christ.
- Quote: "When Christ calls a man, he bids him come and die."




## The Screwtape Letters (1942)

- Author: C.S. Lewis
  - British professor, writer, and apologist
- **Summary:** A satirical correspondence between senior demon Screwtape and his nephew Wormwood on tempting humans away from God.
- **Quote:** "Indeed the safest road to Hell is the gradual one—the gentle slope, soft underfoot, without sudden turnings, without milestones, without signposts."
- "Our cause is never more in danger than when a human, no longer desiring, but still intending, to do our Enemy's will, looks round upon a universe from which every trace of Him seems to have vanished, and asks why he has been forsaken, and still obeys."




## Mere Christianity (1952)

- Author: C.S. Lewis
- **Summary:** Lewis's logical case for Christianity, exploring common ground among Christian denominations and basic Christian beliefs.
- Quote: "A man who was merely a man and said the sort of things Jesus said would not be a great moral teacher. He would either be a lunatic or else he would be the Devil of Hell."



# The Chronicles of Narnia (1950-1956)


- Author: C.S. Lewis
- **Summary:** Seven fantasy novels using allegory to explore Christian themes through the magical world of Narnia and Aslan the lion.
- Quote: "Wrong will be right, when Aslan comes in sight, at the sound of his roar, sorrows will be no more."



# The Lord of the Rings (1950-1956)

#### • Author: J.R.R. Tolkien


- English Philologist, professor, author
- Summary: An epic fantasy trilogy exploring themes of sacrifice, providence, and the battle between good and evil through Christian allegory and symbolism.
- Quote: "All we have to decide is what to do with the time that is given us."



## The Pursuit of God (1948)

#### • Author: A.W. Tozer

- British-Canadian evangelical theologian
- **Summary:** A call to a deeper spiritual life and intimate relationship with God beyond mere religious observance.
- Quote: "God is looking for people through whom He can do the impossible."



# The Knowledge of the Holy (1961)

- Author: A.W. Tozer
- **Summary:** An exploration of God's attributes and the importance of having a proper understanding of God's character.
- Quote: "What we think about when we think about God is the most important thing about us."




# How Now Shall We Live (1999)

- Author: Chuck Colson
  - American attorney, political figure, and prison pastor
- **Summary:** A challenge to Christians to adopt a comprehensive biblical worldview, arguing that faith must shape every aspect of life—from politics to culture to personal ethics—in contrast to the secularism of modern society.
- **Quote:** "The church's singular failure in recent decades has been the failure to see Christianity as a life system, or worldview, that governs every area of existence."



## The Purpose Driven Life (2002)

- Author: Rick Warren
  - American evangelical pastor
- **Summary:** A 40-day spiritual journey exploring God's five purposes for human life: worship, fellowship, discipleship, ministry, and mission.
- **Quote:** "It's not about you. The purpose of your life is far greater than your own personal fulfillment."



## Crazy Love (2008)

- Author: Francis Chan
  - American evangelical pastor and author
- Summary: A challenge to experience God's overwhelming love and respond with radical, wholehearted devotion rather than lukewarm faith.
- Quote: "Our greatest fear should not be of failure but of succeeding at things in life that don't really matter."



## Radical (2010)

#### • Author: David Platt

- American, Southern Baptist pastor
- Summary: A call to abandon comfortable Christianity and embrace the radical demands of following Jesus in a world of urgent spiritual and physical needs.
- Quote: "We are settling for a Christianity that revolves around catering to ourselves when the central message of Christianity is actually about abandoning ourselves."
