This question shapes how we spend our time, how we relate to others, and how we prepare for what lies beyond this life.




The Purpose Driven Life (2002)

- Author: Rick Warren
 - American pastor, Saddleback Church (CA)
- **Summary:** A 40-day spiritual journey exploring God's five purposes for human life: worship, fellowship, discipleship, ministry, and mission.
 - 50 million books sold, in 85 languages
 - #1 best seller, on NYT list for nearly 2 years
 - Barna survey of pastors and ministers: most influential book.

- **Quote:** "It's not about you. The purpose of your life is far greater than your own personal fulfillment."













Discipleship: Created to become like Christ



- Galatians 5:13 "You, my brothers and sisters, were called to be free. But do not use your freedom to indulge the flesh; rather, serve one another humbly in love."




