


Historic Context

- Darwin's Origin of the Species (1859) reduced man to an animal
 - Rationalism/science vs revealed religion
- Higher criticism of Scripture and rise of secular humanism
 - Christianity seen as myth or outdated superstition
- Two world wars
 - Where was God?

Orthodoxy (1908)

- Author: G.K. Chesterton
 - Self-educated British journalist
 - The *Daily News* and *The Illustrated London News*
 - Known for common sense and humor
 - Wrote Father Brown detective stories
- **Summary:** Chesterton's intellectual and spiritual autobiography defending Christian orthodoxy with wit and paradox.
- Christianity is
 - the "answer to the riddle of existence."
 - Not boring, but thrilling



Paradox


- A surprising truth that appears contradictory at first glance but actually reveals a deeper harmony.
- Not logical contradictions to be solved, but creative tensions that reveal Christianity's unique ability to hold together truths other wordviews had to choose between.

Balanced Tensions in Christian Faith HUMBLE tension CONFIDENT MEEK MILITANT about ourselves - - - in our message in relationships - - for truth DEEP JOY SERIOUS about brokenness in salvation




Why Paradoxes Convince

- They match human experience: Life really is complex and contradictory
- They prevent extremism: They force balanced thinking
- **They create intrigue:** Apparent contradictions make people want to understand more
- They demonstrate sophistication: Simple ideologies can't handle life's complexity
- · Chesterton's Method
 - Rather than defending Christianity despite its paradoxes, Chesterton celebrated them as evidence of its truth. A faith that could hold all these tensions together, he argued, must be big enough to contain the full mystery of existence.



The Everlasting Man (1925)

- Author: G.K. Chesterton
- Response to HG Wells' Outline of History.
- **Summary:** A philosophical outline of human history arguing for Christianity's unique place in human development. Christ is at the center.
- Influential in conversion of CS Lewis.




Chesterton's Key Themes

- Christ is the unique answer to history




Mere Christianity (1952)


- Author: C.S. (Jack) Lewis
 - Oxford professor, author, World War II voice
 - Christian to Atheist to Theist to Christian
- **Summary:** Lewis's logical case for Christianity, exploring common ground among Christian denominations and basic Christian beliefs from BBC talks.
- **Quote:** "I gave in, and admitted that God was God... perhaps the most dejected and reluctant convert in all England."





- Practical faith






The Restoration Movement, Chesterton, and Lewis


- Rational approach: reason and evidence





