The Divine Comedy (Inferno, Purgatorio, Paradiso, 1320)


- Author: Dante Alighieri
 - Italian poet and philosopher
- Summary: An epic poem following Dante's journey through Hell, Purgatory, and Paradise, representing the soul's journey to God.
- **Quote:** "In His will is our peace." (*Paradiso*)



The Cosmic Journey

- Hell (Inferno)
 - Confronting sin
- Purgatory (Purgatorio)
 - Growth and purification
- Paradise (Paradiso)
 - Ultimate destiny





Dante's Guides






- Virgil
 - Roman Poet (author of the Aeneid)
 - Represents human reason, intellect, and moral reason
 - Guides Dante through Hell and Purgatory
 - Virtuous pagan, cannot enter Paradise
- Beatrice
 - Real-life acquaintance of Dante
 - Represents Divine Love, grace, and theology
 - Guides Dante into Paradise


The Pilgrim's Progress (1678)

- Author: John Bunyan
 - English Puritan preacher
 - Written while in prison for his faith
- **Summary:** An allegorical tale of Christian's journey from the City of Destruction to the Celestial City, representing the soul's path to salvation.
- **Quote:** "To go back is nothing but death; to go forward is fear of death, and life everlasting beyond it. I will yet go forward."




The Journey

- City of Destruction (Christian's starting point)
- The Slough of Despond (where Christian gets stuck in mire)
- 3. The Wicket Gate (narrow entrance to the path)
- 4. The Interpreter's House (instruction before the journey)
- 5. The Place of Deliverance (the Cross where his burden falls off)
- 6. Hill Difficulty (steep, challenging climb)
- 7. House Beautiful (rest stop with the maidens)
- 8. Valley of Humiliation (where Christian fights Apollyon)



The Journey

- 9. Valley of the Shadow of Death (darkest, most dangerous passage)
- 10. Vanity Fair (town where worldly goods are sold)
- 11. Doubting Castle (Giant Despair's stronghold)
- 12. Delectable Mountains (where shepherds give guidance)
- 13. Enchanted Ground (where pilgrims fall asleep)
- 14. Beulah Land (pleasant country in sight of the Celestial City)
- 15. River of Death (final crossing)
- 16. Celestial City (final destination)




People Christian Interacts With

- Help rescues Christian from Slough of Despond
- Mr. Worldly Wiseman offers alternative path avoiding the cross
- Good-will keeper of the Wicket Gate
- The Interpreter shows Christian instructive visions
- Discretion, Prudence, Piety, and Charity maidens at House Beautiful
- Apollyon the fiend Christian battles in Valley of Humiliation

People Christian Interacts With

- Faithful fellow pilgrim who joins Christian
- Talkative companion who talks well but lives poorly
- Judge Hate-good and Jury condemn Faithful at Vanity Fair
- Hopeful becomes Christian's companion after Faithful's martyrdom
- **By-ends** pilgrim who serves religion for personal gain
- Giant Despair imprisons pilgrims in Doubting Castle
- The Shepherds (Knowledge, Experience, Watchful, Sincere) guide pilgrims on Delectable Mountains
- **Ignorance** self-confident pilgrim taking a shortcut
- The Shining Ones angels who escort pilgrims to Celestial City














In His Steps (1896)

- Author: Charles Sheldon
 - American Congregational minister
- **Summary:** A novel challenging readers to live by asking "What Would Jesus Do?" in every decision and circumstance.
- Quote: "What would Jesus do? He turned and asked himself this question, and it opened up a world of possibilities."

- Opera singer

















