




Why should we be baptized?

- Matthew 28:18-19 ... go, make disciples, baptizing them... teaching them...










Charles Finney

- Contemporary of Campbell and Stone
- Political and social causes, personal reform (works)
- Father of American Revivalism: mourner's seat – anxious seat – altar call - invitation
- "In the days of the apostles, baptism held the precise place that the anxious seat does now, as a public manifestation of people's desire to be Christians."
- Legacy: Dwight L Moody, Billy Sunday, Billy Graham, Promise Keepers, Jerry Falwell

Sinner's Prayer

- Origins: Reformation, revivals, Dwight Moody, Billy Sunday
- Brought to prominence: Billy Graham,
 Campus Crusade for Christ, televangelists
- Revelation 3:20: Here I am! I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will come in and eat with that person, and they with me.
- Romans 10:9 If you declare with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. ¹⁰ For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you profess your faith and are saved... ¹³ for, "Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved."



BAPTISMAL REGENERATION?

Baptismal regeneralationalists

- Baptism in water is the actual moment of salvation
- Restoration movement, Catholics, Lutherans, some Anglicans and Pentecostals







Original Sin and Total Depravity

- Augustine of Hippo (AD 354-430) in response to Pelagius
- Scriptural basis:
 - Psalm 51:5, "I was brought forth in iniquity, and in sin did my mother conceive me";
 - Paul's Epistle to the Romans, 5:12-21, "Therefore, just as sin entered the world through one man, and death through sin, and in this way death came to all people, because all sinned...
- Adam's sinful nature vs Adam's guilt

Original Sin and Total Depravity

- Alexander Campbell: "In Adam, all have sinned; therefore 'in Adam all die.' Your nature, gentle reader, not your person, was in Adam when he put forth his hand to break the precept of Jehovah. You did not personally sin in that act; but your nature then in the person of your father, sinned against the Author of your existence. In the just judgment, therefore, of your heavenly Father, your nature sinned in Adam, and with him it is right, that all human beings should be born mortal, and that death should lord it over the whole race."
- Jack Cottrell: "To sum it up, the individual's spiritual odyssey begins with a theoretical original sin, which is canceled by Christ's original grace, which is (at the age of accountability) canceled by personal sin, which may then be covered by personal grace."

Pedobaptism (or paedobaptism):

infant baptism

- Practiced by Catholic,
 Presbyterian, Methodist,
 Lutheran, Episcopalian, and
 Orthodox
- Mode varies by denomination (sprinkling, pouring, and immersion)
- Purposes vary by denomination, but
 - Mirrors the act of circumcision of the Old Testament.
 - Removes the stain of original sin and bestows grace upon the child.
 - Baptism is generally considered essential for salvation.







Credobaptism:

believer's baptism

- Practiced by Christian Churches / Churches of Christ, Baptists, and some Pentecostals
- Humans are innocent from birth to an age of accountability (usually considered to be about 8-12 years old)
- Purposes for baptism differ:
 - Christian Churches / Churches of Christ holds that scriptural baptism consists of the immersion of penitent believers, the culmination of a process of salvation begun with faith in Jesus Christ, repentance of sin, and public confession of faith in Christ, followed by faithful service to Christ as part of a congregation of fellow believers.
 - Baptists generally believe that baptism is an act of obedience but is not part of salvation ('first act of obedience'). It is an outward expression of an inward change that has already happened.







Method of baptism

- The Greek word 'baptizo' (baptism) literally means to immerse, plunge, or dip.
 - The Greek word for pour is 'ekcheo'; sprinkle is 'rhantizo'.
- Immersion simulates the death, burial, and resurrection of Christ (Colossians 2:11,12; Romans 6:3,4)
- Examples of baptisms infer immersion:
 - John 3:23 John baptized at Aenon because there was plenty of water
 - Matthew 3:13-17 Jesus' baptism, he went up out of the water
 - Acts 8:36 Ethiopian Eunuch, went down into water... came up out of water
- Conclusion: Virtually all scholars agree that immersion was the mode of baptism in the New Testament church.
 - Everyone agrees that immersion is an acceptable mode of baptism, and it is gaining popularity, even in Catholic churches.
 - Those not using immersion today generally argue that the mode of the Testament is not relevant to today's practice.

Didache (Chapter 7)

- (1) Concerning baptism, baptize in this way. After you have spoken all these things, "baptize in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit," in running water.
- (2) If you do not have running water, baptize [baptizon] in other water. If you are not able in cold, then in warm.
- (3) If you do not have either, pour out [ekcheo] water three times on the head "in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit."
- (4) Before the baptism the one baptizing and the one being baptized are to fast, and any others who are able. Command the one being baptized to fast beforehand a day or two.



Key events in sprinkling and pouring

251, Novotion death bed 'baptism'

753, Pope Stephen permitted pouring and sprinkling in case of necessity

1311, Council of Ravenna declared immersion and sprinkling to be indifferent

1643, Westminster Assembly changed Presbyterian practice to sprinkling

1664, Parliament of England repeals immersion law, replaces with sprinkling

Christian Church Baptism

Why? For the remission of sins

Who? Believers

How? Immersion



What happens if we don't get it right?

- The New Testament teaches that believer's baptism is essential to salvation.
- Caveat: God has the prerogative to save the pious unimmersed.
 - There will be pious unimmersed in heaven.
- It is the responsibility of the church to teach prospective members the biblical purpose and mode of baptism.
- Following the example of the New Testament, all members of Christian Churches / Churches of Christ must be immersed as a believer in Christ.
