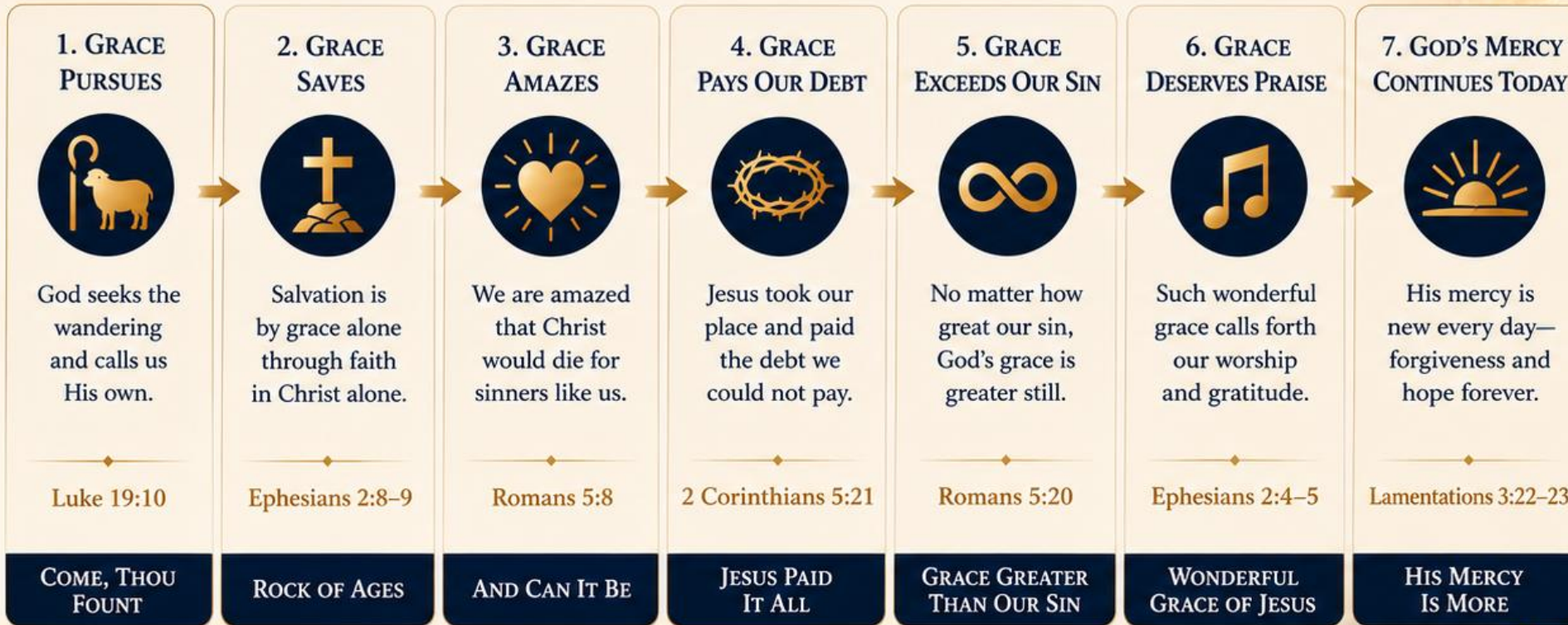

The Story Behind *Come, Thou Fount of Every Blessing*



Robert Robinson (1735–1790)
From wanderer to worshipper



Written in 1757 at age 22
A young pastor's honest confession



“Here I raise mine Ebenezer”
1 Samuel 7:12 – “Thus far the LORD has helped us.”



Prone to wander. Pursued by grace.
Then. Now. Always.

THE MEANING

Ebenezer is a Hebrew word meaning “stone of help.”

It was a stone set up to remember God’s faithfulness in the past and to declare trust in His help for the future.



THE BIBLICAL ORIGIN

After the Israelites had defeated their enemies, Samuel set up a stone and called it Ebenezer, saying, “Up to this point the Lord has helped us.”

1 Samuel 7:12 (NIV)

A REMINDER OF:

- God’s past faithfulness
- His present help
- Our future hope



IN CHURCH HISTORY

Many believers and churches have used “Ebenezer” as a name to memorialize God’s faithfulness through seasons of difficulty, deliverance, and provision.



EBENEZER BAPTIST CHURCH

Est. 1771 – Virginia

One of America’s earliest Baptist churches, founded by settlers who wanted a new beginning centered on God’s help and guidance. They named it Ebenezer in remembrance of God’s faithfulness.



IN THE HYMN

“Ebenezer” is more than a title—it is a testimony.

It reflects the heart of faith:

Remember what the Lord has done, and trust Him for what He will do.

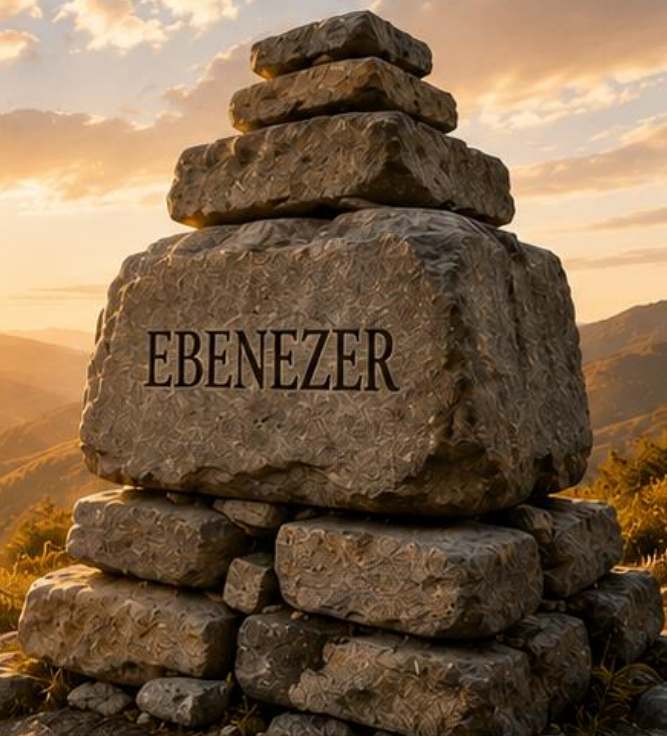

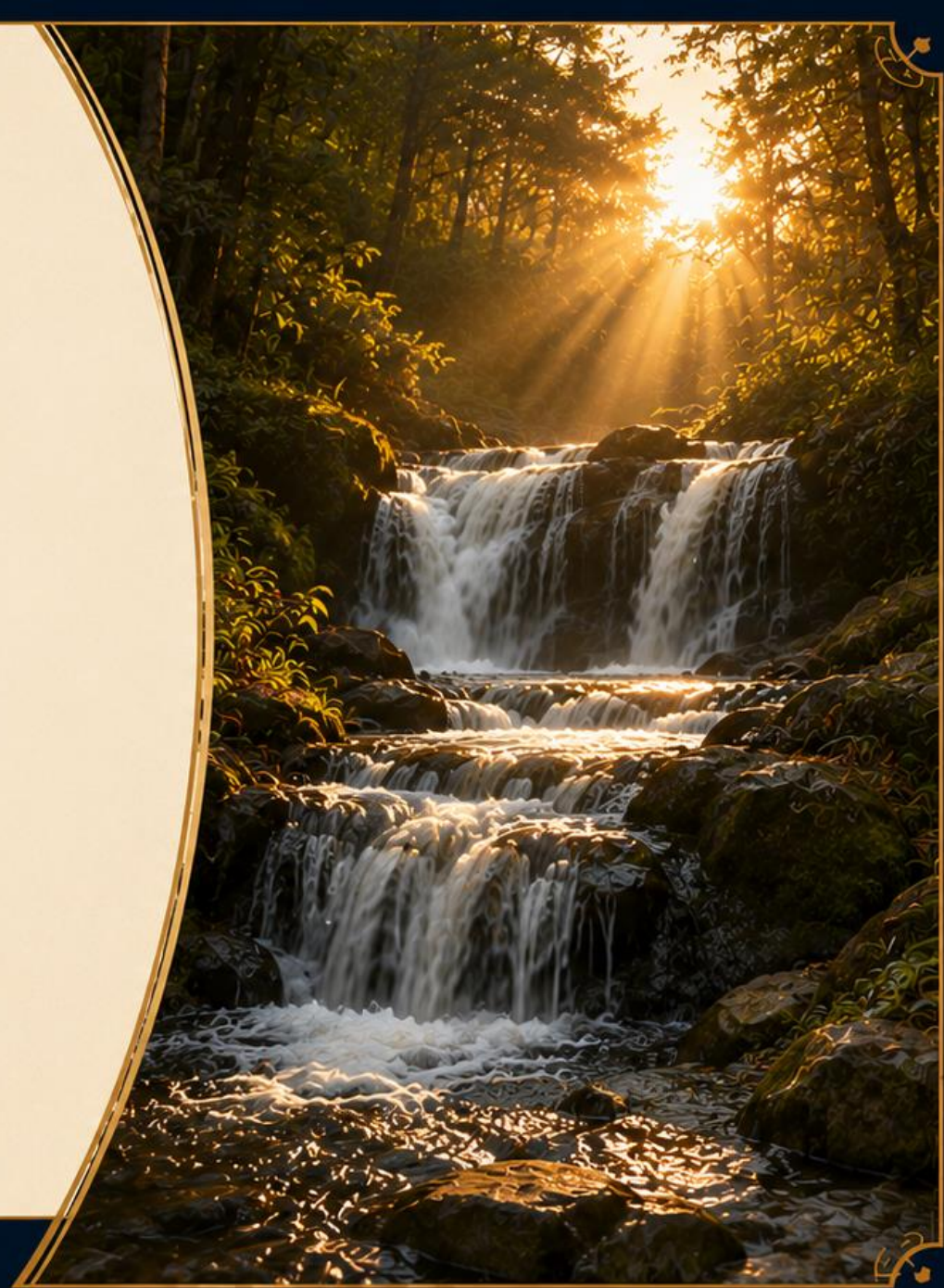

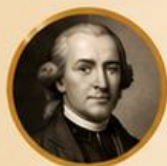

AUGUSTUS TOPLADY (1740–1778)

Converted at 16. Convinced that salvation is entirely God's work.



INSPIRED IN THE STORM (1776)

Sheltered in a cleft in a rock.
The rock became a picture of Christ protecting sinners.



THE MESSAGE: GRACE ALONE

Not only forgives the guilt of sin,
but also breaks its power.
"Nothing in my hand I bring, Simply to Thy cross I cling."

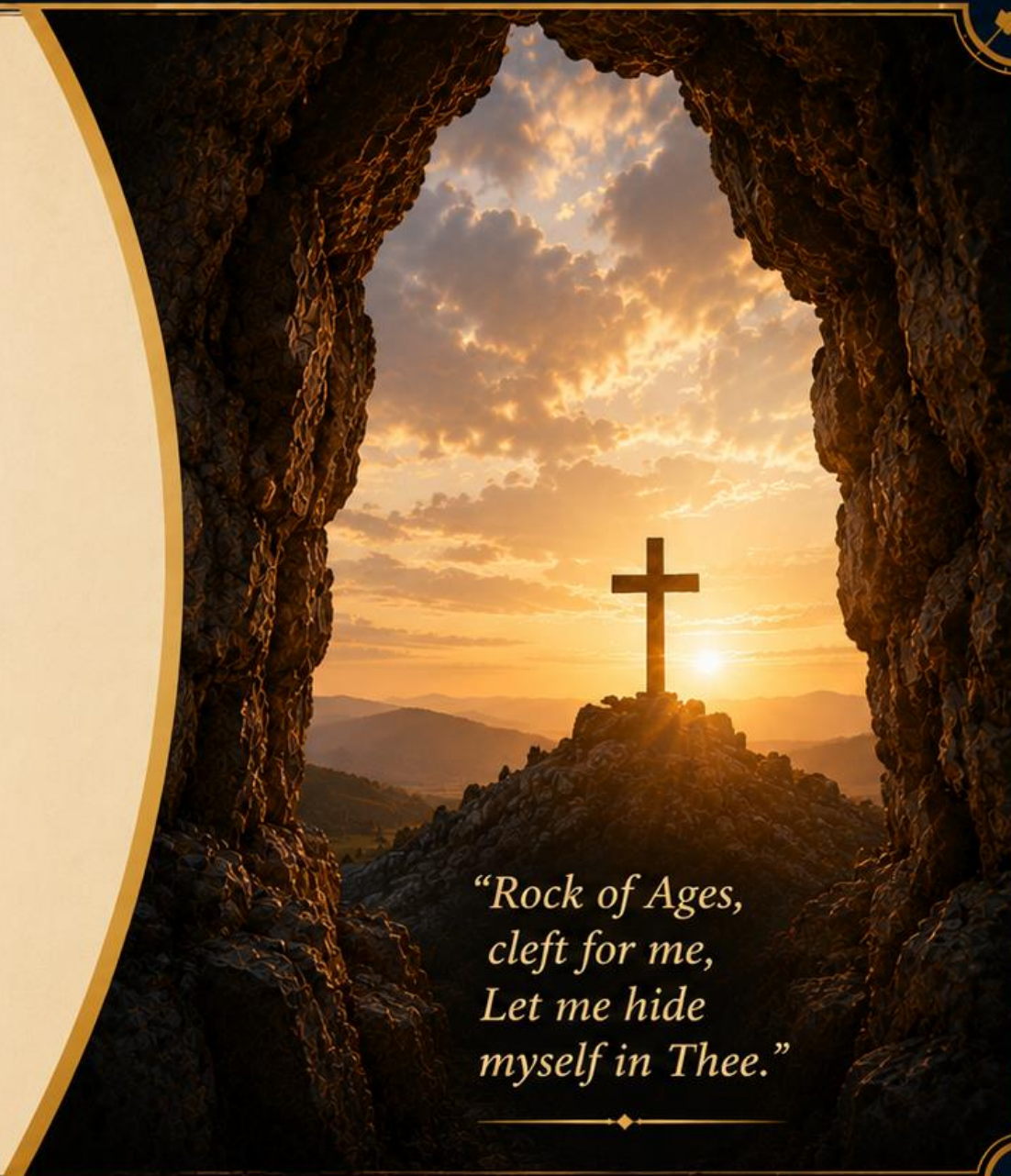

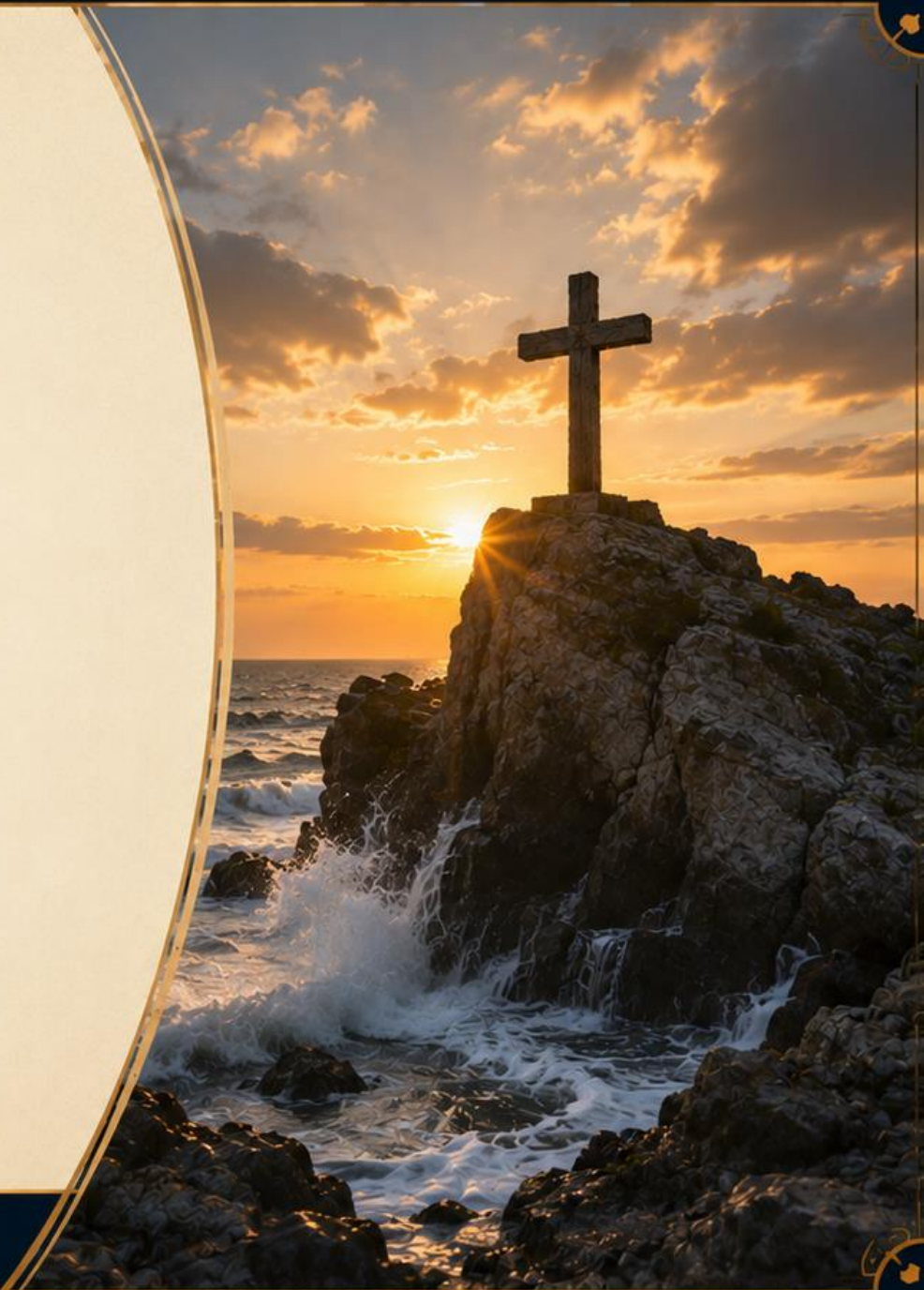

THE AUTHOR

Elvina M. Hall
(1820–1889)

A devoted church member in Baltimore. During a communion service in 1865, the words came to her heart. She wrote them in the margin of her hymnal.

THE AUTHOR
Charles Wesley
(1707–1788)

Pastor, hymn writer.
Wrote over 6,500 hymns.



A LIFE-CHANGING WEEK

May 21, 1738

Charles Wesley receives assurance of forgiveness.

May 24, 1738

John Wesley's Aldersgate experience: "My heart was strangely warmed."

It begins with wonder:

"And can it be that I should gain an interest in the Savior's blood?"



AMAZING LOVE

Christ left heaven and died for me.



SET FREE

My chains fell off, my heart was free.

THE MODERN ARRANGEMENT

TEXT

Uses the same words by Charles Wesley.
The theology remains unchanged.

PURPOSE

Created for choir and concert settings
to tell the story through music.

MUSIC

Through-composed arrangement.
Music builds to match the story and emotion.

STYLE

Rich harmonies, dynamic contrasts,
and expressive choral writing.

ACCOMPANIMENT

Piano with orchestral accompaniment
(often full orchestra).

FOCUS

A musical journey that leads from wonder
to freedom, assurance, and triumph.

TEXT

Charles Wesley's six-verse hymn (1738).
The words that have stood the test of time.

PURPOSE

Written for the congregation to sing
in worship together.

MUSIC

Simple melody, strophic form.
Same tune repeated for each verse.

STYLE

Straightforward and accessible.
Easy to learn and sing.

ACCOMPANIMENT

Piano or organ.

FOCUS

The congregation's response to the gospel.
Clear, heartfelt, and timeless.
